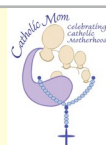

We know summer is a hectic, crazy time for many people. Thank you doubly much, therefore, for being sure to find subs for your scheduled ministry spots. If you are having trouble, please call the office and we'll help as we can.

# Outreach Center Update

The St. Martin de Porres Mission Outreach Center continues to fulfill needs of poor and needy families throughout the community in both Madison and Union counties.

God is working through his people! Your support for this ministry IS making a difference in so many families. St. Joseph parishioners have kept a steady supply of furniture, appliances and household goods coming into the Center since its opening. As word spreads, we are receiving donations from many other areas as well. The stories of those we are serving are heart-wrenching and profound. The need is constant and growing.

To date, we have given away **dozens** of couches, love seats, chairs, tables, lamps, beds, desks, washers and dryers, microwaves and other small appliances (toasters, coffee pots, irons, crock pots, etc.) and **hundreds** of pieces of bedding, towels, pots and pans and dishes.

The inventory turns over constantly, sometimes even weekly! Two businesses in Columbus have "adopted" us as their charity of choice and keep us supplied with towels, bedding and pillows.

If warmer weather has you cleaning out your home, replacing items, etc., don't forget this vital ministry in your parish. Just about anything that still has some life left in it is accepted. We have also posted a **list of items** we accept, as well as those we can not accept at this time at the PAC and the church. Receipts for your taxes are available. A parishioner shared recently that she was able to deduct (following TurboTax guidelines) MORE than she could have sold the items for and

did not have to go to the trouble of a sale!

The Center is also undergoing some changes inside. Dennis Grose recently finished installing additional outlets and overhead lights. Several talented carpenters are working on building a walkway/mezzanine for general parish storage overhead. Later this summer, the Center will also get insulation and a closed ceiling to make it warmer during the winter months.

We have had several youth in the parish accumulate "community hours" by working for a few hours in the Center. If your son or daughter needs these hours, contact me and we will arrange a session. While we work, I try to provide the students



a picture of what the goals of the ministry are, where the referrals come from, and just how the families needing help get to the point of desperation.

Gifts to St. Martin de Porres continue to

support the Inter-Faith House in southwestern Ohio, as well as J.O.I.N., Holy Family Soup Kitchen, Union County Pregnancy Care, Senior Citizen groups, the Union County EAP, plus other special needs.

Sincere thanks to everyone who makes this mission possible! Without the help of the volunteer movers, sorters, folders, loan of trucks and vans, and those who pray for the poor and needy, we simply could not function.

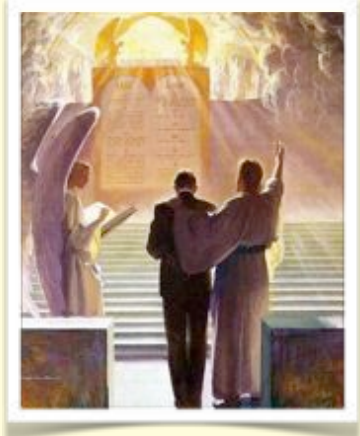

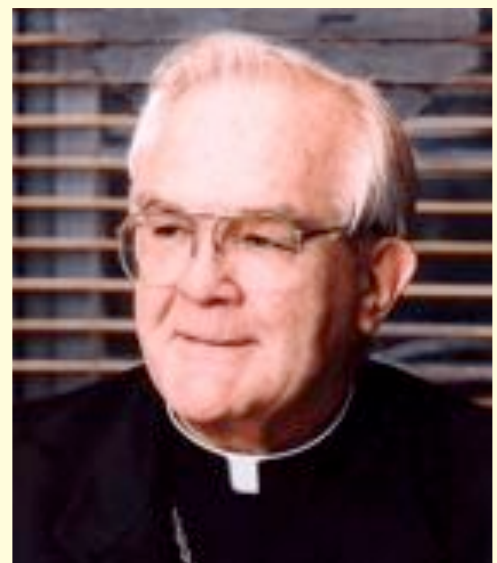
